I. Course Overview

This course is a comprehensive national and global survey of population geography concepts, processes, and patterns. We will begin with key issues related to population growth and continue with key concepts: fertility & mortality, internal & international migration patterns, refugees & displaced persons, future population growth, and finally population-related policies.

II. Course Format

This is a hyflex course with face-to-face meetings and a synchronous live online session through zoom. We will meet in Pugh 120 at 9:35am-10:25am. Most Mondays are reading days and we will not meet for class, please refer to course calendar (at the end of syllabus) for Monday meetings. All student presentation will be delivered through ZOOM.

Discussion Posts (30%): Every Monday you will submit a discussion post related to the reading for the week. There are 10 discussion post (each 3%).

Country Profile (15%): This is a GROUP Project. Students will select one developing country and for an essay submission and a presentation. The essay should analyze and examine issues related to demographics, migration, population growth and some of these on outcomes of health, nutrition, life expectancy, economics, education, etc. Select a few key issues to discuss and justify why you selected this. On Week 7 you will present your research findings.

Film Review (15%): Students will choose a film to review that relates closely to population geography topics covered in the course. The film may be from any era and may be of any format (documentary, historical drama, etc.), but the film must be at least loosely based on actual events or include themes and concepts directly relevant for the course. The review will be between 1500-2000 words, and presentations of the Film Review presentations will take place on Weeks 15-16.

Assignments (30%): There will be 5 assignments throughout the semester related to material from a specific chapter. Assignments will usually have additional readings and/or videos. They will be due on the assigned Friday and we will follow with a ZOOM discussion on the following the Monday.

Labs (10%): We will work with data and the GeoDa softaware on 2 lab assignments related to the migration.
